STORYTELLING & SCREENWRITING

(Studio/Online Course)

Perfect for aspiring filmmakers, writers, and screenwriters looking to push boundaries and unleash their creativity!

Course Description

This course equips students with essential and advanced skills to craft exceptional stories and compelling screenplays. It enhances creative thinking and imagination in storytelling and screenwriting. Students will learn various techniques for creating captivating situations and scenes that keep audiences engaged. Assignments will involve writing scenes, developing characters, crafting situations and dialogues, exploring subtext, and culminating in an industry-ready short-length screenplay.

Duration

4 months (16 sessions), with one class per week, each lasting over 2 hours.

Location

Studio classes will be held at **iO - The Space** (*The Riviera, St 41, Phase 4, Bahria Town, Islamabad*), while online classes will take place simultaneously on Microsoft Teams. Online students will have the opportunity to freely communicate and interact with those attending the studio sessions.

Aims & Objectives

This course aims to delve into the art of film and television screenplay structure, explore dramatic strategies, master proper script formatting, and creatively engage in every stage of original scriptwriting.

Pre-Requisites

A minimum of 10 years of education is required. No prior experience or knowledge of storytelling or screenwriting is necessary, but applicants must have a passion for learning the art.

Final Outcome

By the end of the course, each student will craft an industry-ready short-length screenplay (20 pages) for a film or documentary, adding significant value to their portfolio. Upon successful completion, students will receive a certificate and a personalized letter of recommendation for the institution or organization they aspire to join.

Materials & Equipment Needed

Take Notes: Have a notepad/notebook and basic stationery ready to capture key points, ideas, and class assignments.

Online Class Essentials: For online learners, a laptop, tablet, or mobile device (laptop preferred) with Microsoft Teams installed and a reliable internet connection to join our virtual classroom.

Codes of Conduct

Each student must maintain a minimum attendance of 75% to qualify for the certificate. Any misbehavior towards the teacher or classmates will result in disqualification from further lectures. Students are expected to adhere to general class etiquette.
